Ensemble Policies: All music students are required to participate in the music making life of the department. As such, all music students are required to complete a minimum of two credits in their assigned performing ensemble, then continue to enroll every semester for 0 credits for the entire duration of their degree program.

Students enroll in ensembles for varying credit amounts of 0, 0.5, or 1 credit per semester. Ensembles and credit amounts are chosen in consultation with the advisor. Students are encouraged to participate in secondary ensembles. Secondary ensembles are taken by registering for 0 credits, unless otherwise approved by the department chairperson.

Music students are only exempt from required participation in ensembles while concurrently registered for internship (Music Therapy) or student teaching (Music Education). Students involved in internship or student teaching may continue to enroll in ensembles for 0 credits as their schedule allows. To fulfill the Ensemble requirement, ALL majors must register for an ensemble that directly relates to their primary instrument or voice.

To fulfill the Applied Music requirement, ALL majors must register for the section that directly relates to their primary instrument or voice. This is designated by the department. ALL majors must take Applied Music with the primary instrument they auditioned with when entering the program. Auditioning again is required, if students wish to change to another Applied Music.

Students are required to take two semesters of Vocal Coursework one semester of MUS 195 Vocal Techniques in their first semester and one of the following courses: MUS 130,166,182, 194, or 225

Students who do not pass the standards and expectations of professional dispositions are required to take Professional Growth for Music Therapy Students to set and meet professional goals (See Music Therapy Student Handbook). Failure to pass this course will necessitate withdrawal from the music therapy program.

Students who do not pass music therapy jury may be required to take MUS 283 again or take additional Applied Music. Students must complete PSY 111 and PSY 204 before being placed in Fieldwork.
