Music Education majors must successfully complete requirements for 7 semesters of Ensemble, 7 semesters of Music Education Seminar, and 7 Semesters of Recital Attendance to progress through the program. (Transfer student requirements may be adjusted appropriately at the department's discretion.)

Before taking their first Education course, Music Education majors must:

- participate in an Education interview
- earn at least a B in ENG 1100 (if not then they must take ENG 1200)
- meet with their Education advisor
- and earn a minimum GPA of 3.0 prior to enrolling in any EDU coursework.

MUS 1200 Brass Class + MUS 1210 Percussion Class will be offered in alternate years as MUS 2260 Conducting II. MUS 2180 Conducting I will be offered in alternate years as MUS 1180 String Class and MUS 1190 Woodwind Class. All of these courses must be taken prior to EDU 4890 Student Teaching. Students may take these courses as sophomores, juniors, or seniors. This accounts for the 14–16 credits range in Fall semesters of sophomore, junior, and senior years. MUS 2260 Conducting II may not be taken out of sequence with MUS 2180 Conducting I.

It is strongly advised that students take 1–2 GEN ED courses during intersessions to avoid carrying too many courses while student teaching.

Electives will be adjusted as needed.
