At Molloy University, this includes exploring the political systems of the United States, Europe, Latin America, Africa, Asia, and the Middle East. With a political science degree, students will be prepared for lifelong learning and gain the core communication and adaptation skills that will be valuable in any career.

 - a. Demonstrate leadership.
 - b. Work in a team and individually.
 - c. Interact effectively in a diverse environment.
