### **ART B.F.A. – Concentration in 3D and Sculpture**

The 3D concentration will focus learning on sculpture, clay and various other materials and techniques. Through working with physical materials, students will learn traditional, non-traditional skills and concepts that will give lifelong skills they can draw upon in any profession. Design, concept, intent, spatial recognition and craft are stressed throughout the program.

### **Essential Skills**

Essential skills refer to the knowledge gained from liberal arts education. They provide a framework to guide students' progress toward their degree and prepare students for the broad range of career paths.

1. Intellectual and Practical Skills:
  - a. Oral communication, complex problem solving, innovation and creativity,
2. Personal and Social Responsibility
  - a. Civic knowledge skills and judgment essential for contributing to the community and to our democratic society.
3. Career Readiness:
  - a. Employ active listening, persuasion, and influencing skills
  - b. Keep an open mind to diverse ideas and new ways of thinking.
4. Leadership:
  - a. Plan, initiate, manage, complete, and evaluate projects.
5. Professionalism:
  - a. Be present and prepared
  - b. Have attention to detail, resulting in few if any errors in work.
6. Teamwork:
  - a. Listening carefully to others
  - b. Taking time to understand and ask appropriate questions without interruption.

### **To be eligible for admission, undergraduate students must meet the following criteria:**

- Completion of 12 semester hours in visual art courses (studio, art history, design, etc.)
- Attainment of an overall "B" average in all art courses
- An overall academic average of "C"
- Produce outstanding work.
